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Public space in the contexts of aesthetics, art theory and art practice

The Institute of Aesthetics and Art Culture and the Society for Aesthetics in Slovakia are pleased to announce their seventh conference - Coordinates of Aesthetics, Art and Culture. Submissions are invited in all areas related to public space in the contexts of aesthetics, art theory and art practice. The conference focuses discussions on the transformation of public space in terms of its visual statics and dynamics, as well as in terms of the eventual nature of its fulfillment. So far, reflections have been motivated mainly from an urban or architectural point of view (Worpole 2000; Gehl 2011), however, they rather penetrate into other theoretical discourses and reflections on art theory, philosophy and also into artistic practice.

The dynamic environment of urban living space, especially urban culture that responds most intensively to technological and social changes, follows the social trajectory from private to public. An important part of urban culture is its anchoring in existing and emerging social relationships operating against the background of social and political issues. Public space can be seen from different angles: as an architectural and urban, social, political and ecological issue, through the prism of disciplines such as philosophy, aesthetics, culturology and art history, and others. Its research requires interdisciplinary cooperation of several scientific disciplines but we rightly consider the view of aesthetics, which perceives it as an environment in which aesthetic experience takes place, to be worthy of exceptional attention (Lehtinen 2015).

Contemporary aesthetics divides its interest in public space between the phenomena of non-artistic aesthetics, in other words, processes and objects of everyday life, which are concentrated and take place in public space, and artistic production (performances, site specific events, street art, street theater, etc.), it also includes the most significant element of public space - architecture. With the change in the functions of public space, the essence of artistic expressions (intentions of the creator and organizer, form, expressive attributes) is modified and transformed, which we can perceive, reciprocate, respond to, pass and criticize.

Live art in public spaces is a stable part of functioning of culture and social interactions in most cities around the world. It is no longer just about capitals and the largest agglomerations, on the contrary, thanks to ever-emerging cultural centers, institutions and initiatives of the third sector, we can see this trend in smaller cities as well. If, in past historical periods, the aestheticization of public space was characterized by monumentality, manifested in material objects, statues and monuments (products), current art production in public space is often more focused on socially engaged events aimed at the participation of local people (process). Part of such oriented production is also the education of recipients not only towards art, but often also towards generally valid moral, social, and cultural values.

The aim of the conference is to initiate a discussion on and share professional expertise in exploring public space as a platform for aesthetic experience and experience, interpersonal interactions or an environment offering visual, sound and haptic stimuli. All this motivates theorists and implementers to rethink and formulate questions, hypotheses and theories, accumulating stimuli based on the empire of current institutional and non-institutional artistic practice of "population" of public space and its "filling" with art.
