Graduate profile:

The graduate of this study programme acquires a broad knowledge of historical, cultural and religious aspects of European studies. He/she is able to apply the acquired knowledge in diagnosing and solving complex issues, phenomena and processes underlying the current events on the European continent, continuously improve his/her intercultural competences and participate in the effective implementation of European public policies at the local and regional level.

The multidisciplinary nature of the study programme allows for a better understanding of the complex issues of contemporary Europe from historical, cultural, sociological and religious perspectives. Besides its interdisciplinary character, this study programme focuses on history with an emphasis placed on the political, ideological-religious, cultural and social history of Europe, a comprehensive analysis of the institutional frameworks of the European Union in the 20th and 21st centuries, international relations, European integration processes, the foreign and security policy of the European Union and other relevant actors.

The graduate acquires the ability to historically and critically analyse, interpret and evaluate historical, religious, cultural, social phenomena or processes taking place in Europe.

In the course of their studies, students will acquire the ability to historically and critically analyse, interpret and evaluate cultural, religious and social phenomena and processes taking place in Europe. The study programme provides the student with knowledge pertaining to history, cultural studies, religious studies, political science, sociology, international relations, law and public administration. The study programme profile is complemented by knowledge from other scientific disciplines and therefore contains specific overlaps with other fields of study, such as philosophy, political science, law, sociology, social anthropology, arts and cultural sciences.
