Here is another issue of the 10th anniversary of our journal. In each study the authors present their knowledge in the fields of psychology, social work, history, pedagogy, archeology and spirituality. The first study deals more extensively with the use of signs and symbols in one of the oldest preserved architectural gems of history in the territory of today's Czech Republic and Slovakia.
