## Type, method of educational activities:

1 lecutre/1 seminar per week (full-time study), 13 hours (lecutre)/13 (hours seminar) (part-time study)

Credits: 3

**Degree of study:** bachelor

**Precondition subjects:** none

Conditions for passing the course: Students will discuss study materials submitted in advance. Students will write written exam during examination period. They can obtain 20 pts. for their activity on seminars and 40 pts. for final exam. For granting the credits, students must obtain minimum 10 pts from seminar and 20 pts from final exam. To reach grade A it is needed to obtain minimum 54 pts., for grade B minimum 48 pts., for grade C minim. 42 pts., for grade D minim. 36 pts. and for E minim. 30 pts.

## **Education outputs:**

After completing the course, students will be:

- to identify the most important historical events in the development of Roma ethnics in Europe,
- to put into the relation current problems, that Roma ethnics face, with the historical development of mutual coexistance with majority in Slovakia,
- to distinguish the cultural specifics of Roma ethnics from their social characteristics related to current socio-economic situation.
