<b>Conditions for passing the course:</b> <b>Form of assessment:</b>  <b>Final evaluation:</b> <i>The student will receive an evaluation if:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- During the semester he will process, present at the seminar and submit a seminar paper.</li> <li>- During the semester will pass a continuous test – the minimum success rate of the test is 50%. After successfully passing the continuous test and presenting the assigned task, the student takes the examination in the examination period. To obtain an A rating (excellent) student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains 49% or less will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the presentation of the assigned task, the evaluation of continuous test, and the examination.</li> </ul> <i>If the continuous test in the part time form is replaced by homework, the student will be evaluated after completing at least 50% of homework.</i> <i>At the exam, the student undergoes a final test. The student will be successful in the exam if he / she obtains at least 50% of the required points in the final test.</i> <i>The final grade is determined by the sum of points for the written test (in the case of distance learning for homework), seminar work and for the exam and for the examination as follows: A (100-90), B (89-80), C (79-70), D (69-60), E (59-50), FX (49-0).</i> <i>A student who does not actively participate in the seminars will not be awarded credits.</i>  <i>Teaching methods: the course presupposes the use of mass teaching methods, group teaching, verbal methods (monological, dialogical, work with literature), individual work (homework) and, if necessary, e-learning (such as Moodle or MS Teams and others).</i>
