- The Maccabean Rebellion, the consolidation of Roman power in Palestine, the Herodian government

- Service and position of high priest and priests, Jerusalem temple, Roman prosecutors, religious, family, social and private life of Israelis, parties and groups, important institutions (Sanhedrin), philosophical trends, influence of the Roman Empire.

- General introduction to the New Testament: concept, subject and methods of NT study, number and naming of NT books, order and categorisation of NT books, history of introduction to NT, overview of professional literature, text of NT, ways of preserving NT text, reviews and editions of NT text, translations of the New Testament, methods and principles of scientific analysis of biblical text, literary criticism, problem of inspiration, canon of New Testament books,

*history of Christian exegesis, apocrypha and agraph, Qumran and New Testament.* - A special introduction to the New Testament: generally about the Gospels, testimonies of the first centuries, a complete

introduction to each book of the New Testament.
