Conditions for passing the course: Form of assessment: Final evaluation: <i>The student will receive an evaluation if:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - During the semester, processes, presents at the seminar and submits the seminar paper (student's workload for the preparation and presentation of the seminar paper = 60 hrs.). - During the semester takes a continuous written test - min. the success rate of the test is 50%. After successfully passing the continuous test and handing over the seminar work, the student takes the exam during the exam period. To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains 49% or less will be graded FX. To obtain an A rating (excellent) student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains 49% or less will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of continuous tests and the presentation of the assigned task. <i>If the continuous tests in the part time form are replaced by homework, the student will be evaluated after completing at least 50% of homework.</i> <i>The final grade is determined by the sum of points for the written test (in the case of distance learning for homework), seminar work and for the exam, as follows: A (100-90), B (89-80), C (79-70), D (69-60), E (59-50), FX (49-0).</i> <i>A student who does not actively participate in the seminars will not be awarded credits.</i> <i>Teaching methods: the course presupposes the use of mass teaching methods, group teaching, verbal methods (monological, dialogical, work with literature), individual work (homework) and, if necessary, e-learning (such as Moodle or MS Teams and others).</i>	
Learning outcomes: <i>The graduate of the course will be able in the field of knowledge, skills and competences after getting acquainted with the basic information:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - define and interpret in their own words the basic concepts of social work methods, - characterize the stages of social work, - understand the methods of social work as the focus of its implementation, - apply methods of social work in practice.
