Final evaluation:

The student will receive an evaluation if:

- During the semester will process and present the assigned task using the selected application.
- During the semester he / she takes a continuous written test min. the success rate of the test is 50%. After successfully passing the continuous test and handing over the seminar work, the student takes the exam during the exam period. To obtain an A rating (excellent) student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains 49% or less will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of continuous tests and the presentation of the assigned task.

If the continuous tests in the part time form are replaced by homework, the student will be evaluated after completing at least 50% of homework.

The final grade is determined by the sum of points for the written test (in the case of distance learning for homework), seminar work and for the exam, as follows: A (100-90), B (89-80), C (79-70), D (69-60), E (59-50), FX (49-0). A student who does not actively participate in the seminars will not be awarded credits.

Teaching methods: the course presupposes the use of mass teaching methods, group teaching, verbal methods (monological, dialogical, work with literature), individual work (homework) and, if necessary, e-learning (such as Moodle or MS Teams and others).

Learning outcomes:

The graduate of the course will be able in the field of knowledge, skills and competences after getting acquainted with the basic information:

- acquire the theoretical foundations of theoretical concepts of social counseling,
- understand the connections between the determination of social situations, events and social problems and the possibility of their solution by social counseling,
- acquire the professional basics necessary for the performance of professional activities of social counselors in the practice of social work,
- communicate optimally when working with the client,
- recognize adequate options for solving the client's social problem.

Course content:

- Terminology and subject of social counseling: concept, theoretical definition, practical definition legislative framework of application in social practice.
- Paradigms of social work in social counseling, humanistic approach in social counseling.
- The role of social counseling and the principles of its implementation.
- Specifics of social counseling.
- Basic and specialized social counseling.
- Biodromal conception of human development and development and social counseling. An adult at the center of this counseling, transits, events, development tasks and social counseling.
- Social counseling aimed at target groups to which social assistance and social services are addressed by law and at

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other target groups.

- Social counseling as a social service and professionalization of this service. Social workers and social counseling.
- Preparation and methods of implementation of social counseling intervention.
- Specifics of professional activity within the counseling relationship: social counselor social clients (individual, group, community).
- Evaluation of social counseling as a social service.
- Ethics and ethical dilemmas in social counseling.
