Conditions for passing the course: Form of assessment: Final evaluation: <i>The student will receive an evaluation if:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - During the semester, processes, presents at the seminar and submits the seminar paper (student's workload for the preparation and presentation of the seminar paper = 20 hrs.). - During the semester takes a continuous written test - min. the success rate of the test is 50%. After successfully passing the continuous test and handing over the seminar work, the student takes the exam during the exam period. To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains 49% or less will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of continuous tests and the presentation of the assigned task. If the continuous tests in the part time form are replaced by homework, the student will be evaluated after completing at least 50% of homework. <i>The final grade is determined by the sum of points for the written test (in the case of distance learning for homework), seminar work and for the exam, as follows: A (100-90), B (89-80), C (79-70), D (69-60), E (59-50), FX (49-0). A student who does not actively participate in the seminars will not be awarded credits.</i> <i>Teaching methods: the course presupposes the use of mass teaching methods, group teaching, verbal methods (monological, dialogical, work with literature), individual work (homework) and, if necessary, e-learning (such as Moodle or MS Teams and others).</i>	
Learning outcomes: <i>The graduate of the course will be able in the field of knowledge, skills and competences after getting acquainted with the basic information:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - interpret basic knowledge in the field of sociology (sociology - history and present, social phenomenon and fact, micro- and macro-sociology, culture, socialization and social stratification of society, - describe and characterize the basic concepts of sociology, - characterize and analyze social phenomena, processes and movements. 	
Course content: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Subject of sociology. Origin and essence of sociology. The founders of sociology and their approaches - Auguste Comte, Herbert Spencer, Karl Marx, Durkheim. - Sociology as a product of the crisis. History and present of sociology. Sociological research. - Sociology as learning about society. Social structure (social interactions, groups, organizations, bureaucracy). Culture, socialization (definition of culture, socialization, deviation, process of social control). - Stratification and social inequalities (mobility, minorities, age, gender). Stability and social change (statics, dynamics, evolution, revolution, social change, progress). - Traditional social institutions (family, religion).
