The subject is finished by the exam. During the semester the student prepares, presents at the seminar and submits a seminar work. During the exam period, student will take an verbal exam. To obtain an A (excellent), a student must earn at least 95%, evaluation B at 90%, evaluation C at least 80%, evaluation D 75%, E at least 70%. A student who earns less than 65% will be rated by FX. The resulting evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the seminar work, the written test and the verbal exam.

**Course objective:**

The student is able to:

- describe and explain the assumptions and implications of the case confession
- explain and give examples of the regulation of epitimia in specific cases
- define the conditions for the canonical conduct of the Holy Eucharist and its participation.
- explain the conditions for matrimony, describe the consequences of marriage;
- classify and characterize the hierarchical organization of the Church;
- to distinguish and describe the distribution of synods and dreams, the terms of their calling and recognition, as well as their own words to explain the general principles of their jurisdiction.
- to characterize the organs of ecclesial justice and to set out and execute examples of punishments
- to classify the church property, to discuss the possibilities of its use and to justify its position.
