Final assessment:

During the semester, the student prepares, presents at the seminar and submits the seminar work - preparation for the lesson. During the examination period, he / she carries out a knowledge test and an oral examination. To get A (Excellent), she must earn at least 92%, 84% for B, at least 76% for C, 65% for D, at least 51% for E. A student who earns less than 51% will be rated FX. The resulting evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the seminar work, the knowledge test and the oral answer.

Course objective:

The student is able to:

- define and interpret in its own terms the term in the subject area;
- have an overview of the historical development of the ecumenical movement, thus focusing on the Current Initiatives of the Society of the Orthodox Church in Movement, its consequences on the emergence of the reformation of other churches of religious communities.

Lutheran Tradition, Reformed Tradition, British Reformation, Roman Catholic Response, I. (1869-1870) and II. Vatican Council (1962-1965).
