- formulate the bases for the basic periods of biblical history in the context of archaeological finds;
- characterize the most prominent personalities of the Old Testament on the basis of biblical texts and archaeological discoveries;
- clarify the importance of the most significant discoveries of biblical archeology for biblical exegetics;
- identify and describe the most significant discoveries of Biblical archeology in the Vadi-Qumran region - the Dead Sea scrolls;
- explain in their own words and justify the importance of biblical archeology for the understanding of the Old Testament as a fundamental for the New Testament and Orthodox theology;
- present basic knowledge of biblical archeology in the system of biblical theology.

Course content:

Syllabus of the subject:

The place of biblical archeology in the system of biblical sciences. Stages of archaeological work. Auxiliary disciplines of biblical archeology. Palestinian history in Antiquity. Settlement of Palestine territory and movement of cultures in this area. Palestine's basic cultural epochs. The relationship of nations and cultures in Palestine with neighboring cultures and nations. Development of religious concepts on the territory of Palestine in the context of archaeological evidence. Basic archaeological sites in Palestine. Chronological synchronization of the history of Palestine with the history of ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia. Biblical literature and its relation to archaeological knowledge. Foundations of Archeology. An introduction to biblical archeology, that is, archeology that deals with the context of the nations and cultures mentioned in the Bible and the exegetic literature. Mapping the archaeological history of Palestine and the surrounding area from 3000 BC to the first century AD.
