A student who receives less than 51% will be evaluated as grade FX. The final score is calculated as the sum of the knowledge assessment test and cast work during the semester, and these may, where student activities account for up to 3.1 points.

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**Course content:**

History, concept and subject of personality psychology. Philosophical and theological approaches to personality in history. Psychological definition of personality. Biological and social determinants of personality. Structure, dynamics and personality development. The emergence of development and formation of personality. The development of the phenomenon of "I" as the core of the personality. "I" as the organizing and dynamising factor personality. Self-image and self-assessment. Real and ideal "self." The development of the character of the personality, moral development of personality. Selected theories of personality - psychoanalytic, Constitution, factor-analytic and humanistic. Ideographic meaning, and ideomodifikujúceho nomothetic approach to personality for professional practice of social workers.

Normal and abnormal personality. The criteria of normality and abnormality, the concept of normality. Patopsychológia - the subject and basic terminology. Deviations and disorders of individual psychic phenomena. Psychological problems of permanent disability. And factors of development of mental deviations and disorders - stress, conflict, frustration and deprivation. Syndromes caused by brain damage - cerebral palsy, ADHD ADHD, mental retardation. Syndromes with varying degrees of personality disturbances - neuroses, personality disorders, psychosis. Behavioral disorders in children.
