Course objective:

Learning outcomes

Upon completion of the course the student will be able to:

- Incorporate the Rusyn language into a family of Slavic languages and define its place in the Slavonic writing micro-languages.
- To characterize the Carpathian Rusyn language and its basic variants in: (1) Eastern Slovakia, (2) South-eastern Poland (Lemkovčina), (3) Subcarpathian Ukraine, (4) Hungary (Rusyn is in the stage of revitalization) 5) in Vojvodina, Serbia (Rusyn language of Vojvodina with West Slavonic language base).
- Define the periodization of the history of the Rusyn language, starting with the decay of the paleoslavic unity in the 10th century. and ending in the second half of the 18th century, when the first attempts to codify the literary Slavic languages (focusing on the Eastern group) were created.
- Explain the essence of fundamental changes in 10-11. century. (focusing on Slovak, Rusyn and Ukrainian language): (1) quenching and vocalization of the jers, (2) denazalisation and (3) contraction.
- Determine the basic features of the basics of written Rusyn: the basics of codification has become the dialects of the eastern region of the rusine macroarea
- To characterize the similarities and differences between the normative Rusyn language and normative Slovak language, normative Rusyn and Ukraine Languages and normative Rusyna and normative Polish language.
- Based on the acquired knowledge, he is able to work with the Rusyn text from the prescript period, with professional literature in information library databases.
- To master the basics of interpretation of the Rusyn text from a synchronic and diachronic point of view.

Course content:

Course contents:

1. Place of Rusyn language in the family of Slavic languages. Division of Slavic languages. Settlement of northeastern Slovakia in Valach colonization in the 14th - 17th century.
2. Basic phonological changes in the 10th century. (Extinction and vocalization of the jers, denazalisation, contraction) and their relative chronologies.
3. Periodization of the history of the Rusyn language.
4. Extinction and vocalization of the jers in Slovak, Ukrainian and Rusyn. Structural (internal) causes of uneven squares for jers. Changes in the phonological system after the extinction of jers.

5. Denazalisation (cessation of nasals) in Slovak, Ukrainian and Rusyn. Relative chronologies of contraction and denazalisation.
6. Development of prosodic qualities in Slovak, Ukrainian and Rusyn.
7. Metathesis of Liquids and its results in three basic groups of Slavic languages.
8. Overview of the basic differences in the languages of the West Slavic, East Slavic and South Slavic groups.
9. Characteristic of a typographical Rusyn from a genetic and typological point of view.
10. Similarities and differences of normative Rusyn in relation to the literary Slovak, Ukrainian and Polish.
