- to characterize the most important written works of the Rusyn writings and to include them in the historical period,
- Explain the role of the most important Rusyn organizations and their representatives in the process of solving the basic problems of the national-identification process of the Carpathian Rusyns, including their language issues,
- to differentiate on the basis of available sources of linguistic orientation in the Carpathian Rusyn environment,
- to be orientated in periodics in the context of dominant language orientations,
- to define the objectives of the Rusyn movement in the sphere of language development,
- to characterize the conditions of development of the Rusyn language question before and after 1989.

## A brief curriculum of the subject:

1. Language as a part of national wealth and culture; attempts to process the history of the Rusyn language in the past.
2. Rusyn language question before 1945, main trends of development.
3. 17. st. - Beginning. 18. st. - the most precious Rusyn writings; Church Slavonic and Slavic-Rusyn language among the Rusyns.
4. End of the 18th century. - 1848 - the first grammar and textbooks of the Rusyn language, the problem of language codification (Štúr, Duchnovič).
5. Years 1848 - 1918, the new rusian norm V. Čopej.
6. Years 1919 - 1944 - Rusyn language as one of the two states in the Sub-Carpathian region.
7. Rusyn language question after 1945. 8. 1989 and the return of the Rusyn language question; development of the Rusyn language in Europe.
