**Continuous assessment:**

During the term, the students write a paper as a sociological imagination, which they present in the class. They can reach maximum of 25 points. Active discussion, polemizing in the class, maximum of 15 points.

**Final assessment:**

The final grading is the sum of the oral exam(60points) and class activities (40points) Grading scale A- 100% - 90%, B – 89 %– 80%, C -79%-70%, D- 69% - 60%, E – 59% - 50%, FX –less than 49%. Credits will not be given to students who reach less than 50% out of 100% in each grading part.
