The course is completed by an exam. During the semester, students participate in lectures and actively participate in seminars (elaboration of oral and written homework, group work, discussion). During the exam period, they perform a test and an oral exam. To obtain an A rating (excellent) they must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to a C rating at least 70%, to a D rating 60%, to an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the work in seminars, test and oral exam.

Course objective:

The graduate of the course:

-acquires basic knowledge of the literary science concentrated on literary theory,

-can apply the system of concepts of the German literary science,

-can independently analyze and interpret a literary text in German language in oral and written form.

Course content:

- Concepts of artwork, medium and text in the present and past. Classification of arts, media and texts. Intertextuality and intermediality.
- Heteronomic and autonomous functions of the literature.
- Fundamentals of the theory of science. German studies and German philology.
- Literary science and its disciplines. Literary methodology. Principles and techniques of literary work.
- Basic literary-historical categories and basics of literary criticism. Basics of textology and editorial philology.
- Structural and contextual analysis and interpretation of a literary text. Thematic, compositional and linguistic level of a literary text. Intra-text, out-of-text and inter-text context.
- Basics of poetics and aesthetics, rhetoric and literary stylistics. Basics of production and reception aesthetics. Model of literary communication.
- Basics of themes, narratology, genealogy and versology. Basics of literary comparative studies.
