		<p>The course is completed by an exam. During the term a student writes three partial tests concerning the application of theoretical knowledge into practical exercises.</p> <p>There is a final knowledge test to practical exercises during exam period. A student needs at least 90% for evaluation A, at least 80% for evaluation B, at least 70% for evaluation C, at least 60% for evaluation D and at least 50% for evaluation E. A student reaching less than 50% receives an FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the partial and final tests.</p>
<p>Course objective:</p> <p>The graduate of the course can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - define and use own words to interpret basic concepts from the area of morphology and syntax of the German language and their relations, - identify and classify sentences as basic syntactic units, - identify linear and hierarchical structure of a German sentence as well as a sentence frame and its individual, - use syntactic methods of identification and classification of sentence elements, - classify sentence elements according to their dependency from the verb valence: sentence elements dependent from the valence, - identify and classify semantically and formally valence-independent adverbial complements, - identify formal expression of the sentence elements: phrases and subordinate clauses. <p>Course content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Morphological-syntactic analysis and description of a text (various types and genres): morphological categories of the sentence elements, word connecting into syntagmas (phrases) and their syntactic functions. - Syntactic methods of identification and classification of sentence elements. - Classification of sentence elements according to their dependency from the verb valence: sentence elements dependent from the valence, semantic and formal division of valence-independent adverbial complements. - Topological analysis of sentences and texts. - Complex language characteristics of the analyzed texts. <p>Textbooks and references:</p> <p>DUDEN.
