## Conditions for passing the course:

The course is completed by continuous assessment. During the semester, the student completes control knowledge and practical mini-tests and prepares a seminar work. He/she takes the exam during the exam period. To obtain a score A (excellent) student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B - 80%, to obtain a C - at least 70%, to obtain a D - 60%, to obtain an E - at least 50%. The student who obtains less than 50 % will be graded FX. The final assessment is calculated as the average of the mini-test ratings. For each component, the student must reach the required minimum, otherwise the final evaluation is FX.

Number of credits and time frame for the conditions of passing the course:

# *Learning outcomes:*

**Acquired competencies:** The student is able to analyse professional and practical parameters related to the issue, can independently acquire new knowledge and actively expand

knowledge related to the field, can identify and evaluate the characteristics and functions of lexical units in relation to the whole communication and the intention of the expedient.

- Intralingual types of lexical motivation (paradigmatic, word-formation, morphological, semantic, syntactic, phraseological, interlingual, abbrevional motivation). The nature, dynamics, internal division, implementation in the system and in the text.
- Extralingual types of lexical motivation (expressive, register, terminological, sociolectic, territorial, temporal, individualization motivation). The nature, dynamics, internal division, implementation in the system and in the text.

Conditions for passing the course:

The course is completed by final evaluation. Its successful completion presupposes the achievement of at least 50% of the following activities:

- 1. During the semester, the student prepares independently and in a group analytically and interpretatively focused outputs in relation to the topic and issues of the seminar lesson. The student analyzes and interprets selected artistic texts from children's literature. Max. 20% points.
- 2. The student prepares, presents at the seminar and submits a seminar work as a result of active confrontation of literary knowledge about the selected artistic text and reading experience. Max. 40% points.
- 3. The student presents his / her knowledge of the read primary and secondary texts in the class and in the knowledge test. Max. 40% points.

To obtain a score A (excellent) the student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B - 80%, to obtain a C - at least 70%, to obtain a D - 60%, to obtain an E - at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX.

The final evaluation is calculated as the average of active participation in seminar classes, creation of analytically and interpretatively focused text outputs, evaluation of seminar work and knowledge test.

Number of credits and time frame for fulfilling the conditions for completing the course:

- 1. Each week of the semester course teaching: 2 lectures / 2 seminars: 13 weeks x 4 h = 52 h.
- 2. Each week of the semester, the student prepares the assignment for the seminar (individual work), analytical-interpretative outputs  $(11 \times 2 \text{ h} = 33 \text{ h})$ .
- 3. Individual self-study of study materials and active presentation of knowledge about the topic and problem of the seminar lesson ( $11 \times 4 \text{ h} = 44 \text{ h}$ ).
- 4. Preparation of seminar work in the range of 21 hours.

Total - 5 credits - time consuming - 150 hours.

# Prerequisites:

Conditions for passing the course:

The course is completed by an exam in the form of a test, which contains theoretical and application questions from the topics contained in the syllabus. At the same time, the student submits a seminar paper focused on morphological analysis of the text.

To obtain a score A (excellent) student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B - 80%, to obtain a C - at least 70%, to obtain a D - 60%, to obtain an E - at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The assessment is the average of the test and seminar work.

Number of credits and time frame for the conditions of passing the course:

- 6 credits = 180 hours
- course teaching: 13 weeks / 2 lectures + 2 seminars = 52 hrs.
- individual work preparation for the seminar, elaboration of the seminar work: 59 hours
- self-study of specialized literature and preparation for the exam test: 69 hrs.

In case of interruption of full-time teaching from the regulation of the Public Health Authority of the Slovak Republic / university management / faculty management, teaching and examination will take place in the prescribed distance form.

# Learning outcomes:

Acquired knowledge: The graduate of the course is able to orient in current morphological research, understands the concept of typology and categorization of phenomena in the morphological system and in general in language, understands the relationship of the morphological level to other language levels, understands the term word type and knows the verbal type classification of Slovak, has knowledge of individual verb species at the level of their definition, classification, functions and communication-pragmatic aspects of their use, controls the declension and conjugation norm and understands the factors influencing the formation and use of specific morphological units in speech.

**Acquired skills:** The graduate is able to define the functions of individual morphological phenomena in the construction of the text, can morphologically analyze language material, create correct grammatical units, can actively obtain information about the morphological system of Slovak and its dynamics in the Slovak National Corpus, Slovak language dictionaries and professional literature, critically analyze and evaluate them and use the information obtained to solve practical tasks in the field.

**Acquired competencies:** The graduate of the course is competent to describe and distinguish meaningful and meaningless (basic, superstructure and grammatical) word types, can explain their nature, functions and interrelationships in text analysis and creation, can actively and consciously use knowledge of morphological system and its standard in communication.

#### Course content:

- Word classes, problems of typology. Nature of categorization. Aristotle, Wittgenstein and Rosch. Categorization in common reasoning. Categorization of words into part of speech. Complex word-species classification, basic and non-basic (superstructure, grammatical and specific) word classes. Grammaticalization and lexicalization.
- Nouns, lexical-semantic classification. Gender as a type of agreement, number and cases
  of mismatch of meaning and form within the grammatical category of number, case
  semantics, case syncretism, case synonymy and homonymy.
- Declension of nouns (practical exercises, corpus probe).
- Typology of adjectives, declension of adjectives. Practical exercises.
- Relationship between operability of adjectives and typology of adjectives. Adjectivization of participles.
- Verbal semantics. Lexical-semantic classification of full verbs. Theory of intention and valence.
- Verbal categories and their use in the text: congruent (person and number), update (mood and tense), morphosyntactic (gender) and lexical-grammatical (voice). Category of personality.
- Semantic classification of adverbs within the class of adverbs formed from adjectives and nouns.
- Superstructure word classes: pronouns, numerals.
- Grammatical word classes: conjunctions, prepositions, particles.
- Prepositions, system-structural, lexicographic and communication approach to the research of prepositions. Relationship between prepositions and case semantics (modification and specification properties of prepositions).
- Conjunctions, function, relation of conjunctions, conjunctive expressions, connectors, relative and correlate, connective subsystem in language
- Particles, classification according to the communication function of the statement.
- Interjections, specifics of interjections in terms of ontogenesis of speech, sound and graphics, in terms of dichotomy motivation and arbitrariness.

Conditions for passing the course:

When preparing the bachelor's thesis, the student follows the instructions of his supervisor and the Directive on the requirements for final theses, their bibliographic registration, control of originality, storage and access issued by the University of Prešov. The scope of work can be determined by the training workplace, while the recommended scope is without appendices (from the introduction to the conclusion, inclusive) 30 to 40 standard pages (54,000 - 72,000 characters). The structure of the work and the formal arrangement of the work are determined by the Directive on the requisites of final theses in agreement with the supervisor. The final variant of the bachelor's thesis bound in hardcover is handed over by the student to the department that announced the topic of the thesis. The deadline for submitting bachelor's theses is set in the schedule of the relevant academic year.

The bachelor's thesis is submitted in two printed copies, its electronic version, which must be identical to the printed version, is entered by the student into the system MAIS in PDF format, no later than seven days after submission of the printed version. The originality of the work is assessed in the central register of final theses. A report on the originality of the final thesis is prepared on the result of the originality check. Control of originality is a necessary condition of defense. Based on the result of the overlap of work with other works, the trainer decides whether the work can be the subject of a defense.

Part of the transfer of work is the conclusion of a license agreement on the use of a digital copy of the work between the author and the Slovak Republic on behalf of the university. After inserting the work into the system MAIS, the author immediately submits a draft license agreement signed by him to the training workplace, which must be signed by an authorized representative of the university (the head of the training workplace) within 30 days of sending the work to the CRZP.

The bachelor's thesis is assessed by the supervisor and the opponent, who prepares the assessments according to the set criteria.

The commission for the final state examinations in a closed session will evaluate the course of the defense and decide on the classification. During the classification, it comprehensively assesses the quality of the work and its defense, taking into account the opinions and the course of the defense, and evaluates with one common mark. The final assessment can be the same as in the testimonials, but it can also be better, as the case may be worse, depending on

the course of the defense. The final evaluation can be the same as in the testimonials, but it can also be better, resp. worse, depending on the course of the defense. The decision on the result of the defense will be announced publicly by the chairman of the commission together with the result of the relevant state final examination.

## *Learning outcomes:*

**Acquired knowledge:** The graduate knows the principles of the defense of the final thesis, knows how to present the results of the final thesis. He has knowledge of the structure and creation of the content of the speech, the adequate way of its delivery with respect to the principles of academic ethics.

**Acquired skills:** The graduate has acquired the ability to defend their own work and present the results of the final work, is able to argue convincingly, justify the choice of topic, its relevance, practical contribution and respond to questions and comments of the supervisor and opponent.

**Acquired competencies:** After completing the course, the student will have the ability to independently and creatively use professional sources, analyze and evaluate the current state of the problem, synthesize and apply the acquired theoretical knowledge in the bachelor's thesis, present and defend their position in terms of the goal and its contribution, language and professional culture and own attitude to the professional problems of their studies.

### Course content:

The defense of the bachelor thesis has a stable course:

- Introductory word of the graduate, presentation of the results of the final work.
- Presentation of the main points from the written opinions of the supervisor and the opponent.
- Answer of the student to the questions of the supervisor and the opponent.
- Expert discussion on the bachelor's thesis with questions for the student.

The bachelor's thesis is available to the commission during the defense. The introductory word should contain in particular the following points:

- Brief reasoning of the choice of topic, its topicality, practical benefits.
- Clarification of goals and methods used in work processing.
- The main content problems of the work.
- Conclusions and practical recommendations reached by the author of the work.
   During the presentation, the student has his / her own copy of the bachelor's thesis, or an introductory presentation prepared in writing. The student will present the speech independently. The student can use computer technology. The introductory performance should be short, not exceeding 10 minutes.

- prepares a short popularization text in writing approaching the selected orthographic issues (the so-called language window) as a starting point for a 3-minute recording.

For each part of the continuous evaluation, the student must obtain at least 50% of the determined point evaluation. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of partial evaluations and active participation in seminars. To obtain an A (excellent), the student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B - 80%, to obtain a C - 70%, to obtain a D - 60%, to obtain an E - at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX.

The student masters spelling principles, can justify them theoretically and uses them in creating his own texts and proofreading foreign texts.

- a) a) Introduction (Refers to the topic specifically and introduces the reader to the issue. It contains clear information about the problem or project, the reasons why the author is dealing with it.)
- b) b) the core (The main part of the text is divided into chapters, subchapters, paragraphs, subparagraphs, etc. Each main part starts on a new page. The logical sequence of chapters is important.)
- c) Conclusion (Factual conclusions, own contribution or view are summarized by the author at the end of the thesis. The conclusions provide a brief description of the work with the

- evaluation of results and estimation of significance for theory and practice. The conclusions must follow the interpretation, considerations, descriptions and arguments at the heart of the work.)

The lecture unit provides a basic developmental outline of the period under study (1945-1989), presenting analyses of literature in its aesthetic, cultural and social contexts, showing literature in synchronic and multichronic comparisons, and making connections with other scholarship on the literature of the period. The lecture complements the independent study of the fundamental phenomena of the period, which the student actively develops through home preparation on the set topics of the lectures.

The The course is completed by passing an exam.is carried out in the form of 2 knowledge tests and a final exam: 1 continuous knowledge test (25% share of the final evaluation), 1 final test (25% share of the final evaluation) on the knowledge acquired during the semester and a final exam (50% share of the final evaluation), which takes the form of an oral or written answer to the questions set at the beginning of the semester. Completion of the lecture part is realized by an continuous evaluation, in the form of a knowledge test and an independent semester work: 1 continuous knowledge test (50% share of the final evaluation) of the knowledge obtainable from the subject during the semester and 1 semester work (50% share of the final evaluation), which takes the form of an analytical interpretation of a literary work in the context of a complex literary and cultural situation.

To obtain an A (excellent), the student must obtain at least 90 %, to obtain a B - 80 %, to obtain a C - at least 70 %, to obtain a D - 60 %, to obtain an E - at least 50 %. The student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of active work in seminars, evaluation of semester work and continuous test.
