**Learning outcomes:** Student will understand the relations between macroeconomic analysis, economic policy theory and practical implementation of economic policy. He/she will be oriented in a wide range of theoretical approaches to the application of fiscal and monetary policy instruments and to the design of the economic-political mix. He/she will understand the relations between the instruments and objectives of economic policy, he/she will learn to functionally compare and evaluate the effects of economic policy measures.
