- The Mongols' invasion of Eastern Europe, their influence on developments in this part of the world. Golden Horde and the Russian principalities in it. Moscow as the new center of the unification of the Russian state. The end of the Golden Horde and the first Russian imperialism.
- -The period of "opričniny", "smuta", "samozvanstvo" and Polish aggression, the second

national "opoleni". The rise of the Romanovs to the Russian throne.

- The creation of the Russian Empire, Peter's reforms.
- -"Popetrovsky" period. The peculiarities of the development of the Russian Empire in 1725-1762.
- -Absolutism of Catherine II. The achievements of Russian diplomacy and Russian armed forces, the annexation of new territories, the new administrative and economic arrangement of the country.
- -Paul I's government, Alexander I's last palace coup, Napoleon's aggression, patriotic war of 1812.
- The restless 19th century, the pursuit of reform. Decabrists, abolition of servitude, socialist movement, the Russian-Japanese War.
- -XIXth century historical events and shaping of the golden period of Russian literature.

Method: full-time form of defending a bachelor thesis at the end of the first degree of study

**Recommended study semester:** 6

Study grade: 1.

### **Prerequisites:**

All compulsory subjects and compulsory optional to the extent that is a necessary condition of the right to participate in state final examinations and defence of bachelor thesis in accordance with the current regulation of the Study Regulations of the IE so that he/she ultimately obtains at least 180 credits for the entire study.

# Conditions for passing the course:

The course ends with an oral defence of the final bachelor thesis, preceded by an ongoing review of the student's thesis, consultations with the thesis supervisor and/or consultant. During the semester, the student submits proposals for solving the analyzed issue, presents knowledge from the studied theoretical knowledge database and partial outputs at consultations, which ultimately result in the application level of the topic being solved. Within the specified time limit, the student submits, in the prescribed form and within the defined scope, independently processed content-complete work, the result of his own research, to his trainer or another authorized employee of the given academic institution; the work is then handed over to the EZP central register for checking the value of the author's share, on the basis of which the trainer or an authorized teacher will improve the work, or draw attention to the collision and will take a position on the next procedure. In order to obtain the final grade A (excellent), the student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain the grade B 80%, to obtain the grade C at least 70%, to obtain the grade D 60%, to obtain the grade E at least 50% of the value scale defined by the academic department and the board for defence and state bachelor examinations. A student who receives less than 50% will be assessed by FX, as well as in the event of a material breach of the provisions applicable to the case (e.g. detection of unfair practices).
