To obtain the final grade A (excellent) the student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a rating B 84%, to grade C at least 75%, to grade D 65%, to grade E at least 51% of the value scale defined by the academic workplace and the commission for defenses and state bachelor's exams. Part of the practice is also assistant activities and extracurricular activities at least 3 hours in person. Based on the student's activities within the school, the practicing teacher will prepare Student Assessment, in which they will write a recommendation - to grant - not to grant credits for the accomplished practice.

## **Learning outcomes:**

Continuous pre-service practice 3 students will acquire additional teaching skills at primary and secondary schools, skills, teacher's competences in preparing the lesson on a specific topic, in diagnosing and evaluating students, planning and organizing and managing the lesson. In the psychomotor area, they will gain the ability to implement: analysis of basic teaching methods, description of the purpose of teaching a particular subject, analysis of basic documents - SEP, SEN, thematic plans of teachers, educational standards, profiles of completions of a particular school and the ability to specify in different types of schools. They will try the creative implementation of specific teaching methods and in the subsequent analysis with the practicing teacher they will gain a self-reflective picture of the level of their abilities and personality traits.
