

Abstract of the *Journal of Sociotherapy*, Issue 2/2025: *Social Justice*

The present issue of *Journal of Sociotherapy 2/2025: Social Justice* focuses on the current social justice priorities – Voting rights, Environmental justice, (e)Immigration, Economic justice, Criminal justice, and Juvenile justice – as identified by the *National Association of Social Workers (NASW)*.

Social Justice is one of the key areas of modern social work, on its micro, mezzo and macro levels. The basic value of social work is the belief in the requirement of equal treatment of each client, regardless of their economic status, disadvantage, ethnic or religious affiliation, or life situation.

In the current socio-political and environmental state-of-affairs, modern social work has become irreplaceable as it encompasses a broad spectrum of social work interventions. It has taken a primary role in promotion and protection of fundamental human, economic, and political rights, but also in securing equal access to natural, social, and economic resources and opportunities.
