Prerequisites: -Conditions for passing the course: The course is completed by a colloquial examination, after submission and positive evaluation of the semester work. The thesis is in the form of an essay and consists of two parts: the first part is a reflection on the knowledge of history in the works of philosophers and historians from the earliest times to the present; the second part is a reflection on the knowledge of those historians that are the subject of the dissertation, while higlighting and refelcting upon the limits in the work of the given historian(s) (still using the example of the dissertation), the meaning and significance of historical criticism, etc., That is to say; the task of the historian to know and understand "his" section of history and to interpret it in such a way that "my" image of the past is identical with the past itself, but also that "my" image of the past is reflected in the mind of the reader, the listener, in the same form as it is in the mind of the historian. Thus, care must be taken to avoid unnecessary shifts, and thus a false image, in the interpretation of the period under study.

Number of credits and time limits for fulfilling the course requirements. These are awarded as follows: 3 credits for the term paper, 2 credits for the answer at the colloquial examination.

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Both parts are graded with points: term paper 0 to 6 points; answer 0 to 4 points. In order to pass the course, the student needs to earn a total of at least 7 credits.

Learning outcomes:

The student will gain a basic overview of the views on history as an objective process and on history as a science. The student will acquire knowledge of the basic sources of historical sources and will be able to identify and research them as necessary, master the methods of historical research and work with professional literature.

Acquired knowledge: the student will gain a basic overview of the characteristics of historical periods, the philosophy of history and information about the functioning and importance of the sources with which the historian works.

Skills acquired.

Acquired competences: the student is able to analyse information, to put it into a broader context, to reconstruct an objective picture of the past.

Written exam:

1. Preparation and presentation of an outline of the dissertation, approx. 500-600 words (35 %)

2. Structured CV - Curriculum Vitae (Europass) (5 %)

3. Resume from relevant literature studied (20 %)

Oral examination - on the following topics:

1. student's own scientific work and literature

2. cooperation with other disciplines and organisations

3. publications and conference presentations

Assessment:

60 % processing of the prescribed written materials and presentation of the thesis project 40 % oral examination

Learning outcomes:

The successful graduate of the course will:

1. acquire general communicative language competences, on the basis of which he/she is able to present his/her work, the results of his/her research and demonstrate knowledge of relevant literature in Hungarian.

2. acquire adequate inguistic competence at B2 level (according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) to present not only oneself in everyday situations, but also the results of one's own academic work.

3. develop pragmatic competences to be able to interact meaningfully in a variety of situations related to his/her professional profile.

4. be able to respond appropriately to inter/multicultural contextual linguistic stimuli.

5. be able to present his/her work according to speech communication criteria using the latest technology.

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integrate relevant information and sources into an oral speech according to the principles set out through practical exercises, master stress management techniques

- in the affective domain the student will be able to:

respect the principles of linguistic expression in a multicultural space

construct different types of speeches and, on the basis of experience, be able to evaluate adequately the speeches of others, etc.

show self-reflection and self-criticism

- in the psychomotor domain student:

will be able to process relevant sources and through mind maps, V-schemes, etc.

will be able to work with the Internet and techniques for presenting speeches (e.g. Prezi, PPT, etc.)

Brief outline of the course:

The content focuses mainly on the specifics of professional written expression in Hungarian, the techniques of written expression, their structuring (criteria and requirements for writing abstracts, resumes, conference papers, dissertations, etc.)

- Structured curriculum vitae - CV (Europass).

- Techniques of oral expression (organisation and structure, use and support of information with relevant sources according to the principles of academic ethics, effective transitions between the different parts of speech)

- Reading comprehension and translation of popular and academic texts.

- Development of vocabulary focused on professional orientation.

- Oral and written presentation of the content, methods, and forms of their own scientific research work.

- Professional and social conversation on a variety of topics (workplace, job, study).

- Presentation of the literature studied, information about the dissertation (specification of the title, choice of topic, aims and methods of work, own research, conclusions, contribution, professional cooperation).
