Conditions for passing the course:

The course ends with an exam. During the semester, the student actively participates in lectures and seminars, with a tolerance of 3 justified absences, which will be replaced by additional work. During the semester, the student processes, presents at the seminar and submits a seminar paper. During the exam period, he performs an oral exam or test. To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the seminar work and its PP-presentation (30%), seminar activities (20%) and final test or exam (50%).

Learning outcomes:

Knowledge

The graduate of the course will acquire and expand their knowledge in the field of linguistics. He will enrich his terminological apparatus from the discipline, he will remember the necessary facts and definitions. He knows the division of linguistics and related sciences. They will learn the classification of languages. He knows the individual language levels. They will learn Rusyn terminology on the subject in a confrontational view with the Slovak language. Skills

Can characterize the language system and its subsystems on basic language levels (sound, morphological, syntactic and lexical-semantic).

Compulsory course, 1 hour seminar/1 hour Practical seminar, combined method

Conditions for passing the course: Continuous assessment

During the semester, the student works in seminars in the form of practical exercises to acquire the skills of practical communication in the Ruthenian normative language. He acquires the orthographic norm in the form of dictates and self-dictates, and acquaints himself with practical orthography by reading examples of Ruthenian fiction and journalism. At the same time, he prepares a short stylistic work (in the range of 1.5 - 2 pages) for each seminar on pre-determined topics, which he will receive at the beginning of the semester. Based on grammatical errors in students' work, the lecturer gradually explains the individual orthographic rules. The condition for granting credits is active participation in seminars, submission of all developed topics (a total of 6 topics), completion of all worksheets (or dictations and work tasks). To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 92%, to obtain an B rating 84%, to obtain a C rating at least 76%, to obtain a D rating 65%, to obtain an E rating at least 51%. A student who obtains less than 51% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of individual evaluations of worksheets and evaluations of the developed topics, and the activity at seminars is also taken into account.

Learning outcomes:

The graduate of the course is able to present:

Knowledge

- be familiar with the Ruthenian graphics system, recognize all graphemes, all phonemes and their correct pronunciation,
- to distinguish the graphic system of the Ruthenian normative language and the graphic systems of the neighboring Slavic languages (especially Ukrainian and Slovak), to show, on the basis of comparison and also the contrast, the differences in the graphic system (vocal and consonantal) in these languages;

Skills

- read texts in Ruthenian normative language fluently and with understanding,
- formulate answers to the questions asked correctly and logically, while being able to combine, use and develop new solutions,

- write short stylistic units in Cyrillic;

Attendance at seminars is mandatory. Students will write a seminar paper on the assigned topic. The students submit the seminar work to the teacher in printed form within the set deadline. Two weeks before the end of the semester, students take a written test. (1) for active seminar work: 40 points (40%), (2) for seminar work: 30 points (30%) and (3) for the written test: 30 points (30%). To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating at least 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of active participation in seminars, seminar work and written test.

Learning outcomes:

After completing the course, the student will be able to obtain:

Knowledge

Read and rewrite Old Slavic texts in Cyrillic. Translate Old Slavonic texts using a dictionary into Slovak, resp. Ruthenian. To characterize Old Slavonic as the first literary language of the Slavs in a broader Slavic context.

Skills

Define the basic language features of Old Slavonic. Explain and define the relationship between basic concepts in Paleoslavism: Proto-Slavic - Old Slavic - Church Slavonic and its editorial staff. Demonstrate the ability to interpret an Old Slavic text with a definition of its basic grammatical features. Masters the basics of the morphological system of Old Slavonic.

Competences

Gain a good orientation in the overview of Old Slavonic monuments and in the basic textbook literature on Old Slavonic. To characterize the stand and significance of the activities of the Slavic believers of St. Cyril and St. Method for the cultural development of the Slavs. On the basis of the acquired knowledge to be able to work with Old Slavic and Church Slavonic texts, with professional literature in information book databases. To master basic linguistic terms from Paleoslavist literature and to use them correctly in the description and characteristics of standard Ruthenian and Slovak.

Course content:

The importance of studying the Old Slavic language. Sources of study. Cyrillic table. Reading an Old Slavic text. Principles of pronunciation of Old Slavonic sounds. Translation. The place of Old Slavonic among Slavic languages. Slavic graphics: Cyrillic and Glagolitic. Current state in Slavic languages. Textological analysis of normalized and non-normalized Old Slavonic text. Monuments of the Old Slavic language. Division and overview. History of the study of the Old Slavic language. Declension system of Old Slavonic, formation of basic verb forms. Old Slavonic. Its origin, the oldest developmental stages and local differentiations.

Learning outcomes:

Knowledge

The graduate of the course will gain an overview of the extent and abundance of the Ruthenian population in the Carpathian region, in enclaves and diasporas. They will learn basic information about Ruthenian historiography. He will gain knowledge about the Upper Potis in the period of prehistory, early Middle Ages until 1526.

Skills

The graduate is familiar with the historiography of the Ruthenians. He has an overview of the basics of the concept of the main groups of historians. He knows the development of the settlement of Upper Potis in prehistory and at the beginning of the historical period. He can integrate it into the Hungarian state and define the development in the 11th and early 16th centuries.

Can demonstrate a good orientation in the review of literature devoted to this issue. Can search, process and analyze information from a variety of information sources and interpret and publicly present this knowledge using appropriate terminology.

A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX.

Secular folk poetry of the 18th century. «Scholastic poetry». Vasily Dovhovich and his poem "Poemata Basilii Dohovits".

Due to the fact that students have another linguistic discipline in this semester - morphology focuses on breaking the rules by students in this language level. The condition for granting credits is active participation in seminars, submission of seminar work and its presentation to colleagues, completion of all worksheets (or dictations and work assignments). To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 92%, to obtain an B rating 84%, to obtain a C rating at least 76%, to obtain a D rating 65%, to obtain an E rating at least 51%. A student who obtains less than 51% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of individual evaluations of worksheets and evaluations of the developed topics, and the activity at seminars is also taken into account.

(Who? What does he do? What? When? Where? How? What? What does he write?) 10. Identify sentence members, part of speech in sentences and represent sentences graphically.

When preparing the bachelor's thesis, the student follows the instructions of his supervisor and the Directive on the requirements for final theses, their bibliographic registration, control of originality, storage and access, issued by the University of Prešov in Prešov. The scope of work can be determined by the training workplace, while the recommended scope is without appendices (from the introduction to the end, inclusive) 30 to 40 standard pages (54,000 -72,000 characters). The structure of the work and the formal arrangement of the work are determined by the Directive on the requisites of final theses in agreement with the supervisor. The final variant of the bachelor's thesis bound in hardcover is handed over by the student to the department that announced the topic of the thesis. The deadline for submitting bachelor's theses is set in the schedule of the relevant academic year. The bachelor's thesis is submitted in two printed copies, its electronic version, which must be identical to the printed version, is entered by the student into the system of registration of final theses in PDF format, no later than seven days after submission of the printed version. The originality of the work is assessed in the central register of final theses. A report on the originality of the final thesis is prepared on the result of the originality check. Control of originality is a necessary condition of defense. Based on the result of the overlap of work with other works, the trainer decides whether the work can be the subject of a defense. Part of the transfer of work is the conclusion of a license agreement on the use of a digital copy of the work between the author and the Slovak Republic on behalf of the university. After inserting the work into the EZP PU, the author immediately submits a draft license agreement signed by him to the training workplace, which must be signed by an authorized representative of the university (the head of the training workplace) within 30 days of sending the work to the CRZP. The bachelor's thesis is assessed by the supervisor and the opponent, who prepares the assessments according to the set criteria. The commission for the final state examinations in a closed session will evaluate the course of the defense and decide on the classification. During the classification, it comprehensively assesses the quality of the work and its defense, taking into account the opinions and the course of the defense, and evaluates with one common mark. *The final evaluation can be the same as in the testimonials, but it can also be better, resp. worse, depending on the course of the defense. The decision on the result of the defense will be announced publicly by the chairman of the commission together with the result of the relevant state final examination.*

Each seminar includes a discussion of the problems (technique and level) of translation with an emphasis on the selection of the most suitable equivalents from the Rusyn vocabulary and the stylization characteristic of the Rusyn language. In the credit week, the student submits the entire translation of the assigned text with a lexicographically arranged dictionary. To obtain grade A (excellent) the student must obtain at least 90%, to obtain grade B 80%, to grade C at least 70%, to grade D 60%, to grade E at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the translated text (40%), the developed translation dictionary (40%) and the activities at the seminars (20%).

A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the seminar work and its PP-presentation (30%), seminar activities (20%) and final test (50%).

During the semester, the student works in seminars in the form of practical exercises (worksheets) to acquire the skills of practical communication in the Ruthenian normative language. He acquires the orthographic norm in the form of dictates and self-dictates, and acquaints himself with practical orthography by reading examples of Ruthenian fiction and journalism. At the same time, he prepares a short stylistic work (in the range of 1.5 - 2 pages) for each seminar on pre-determined topics, which he will receive at the beginning of the semester. He presents his work to colleagues in the Power Point program. Based on grammatical errors in students' work, the lecturer gradually explains the individual orthographic rules. Conditions for passing the course: continuous assessment

During the three-week summer school, the student works in seminars in the form of practical exercises to acquire the skills of practical communication in the Ruthenian normative language. Acquires the orthographic norm in the form of dictates and autodictates, while dictations are conceived with emphasis on changes and corrections in the rules of Ruthenian orthography (changes implemented after 10 years - in 2005 and after twenty-five years - by issuing spelling rules with orthographic dictionary at the end of 2019). The condition for granting credits is active participation in seminars, submission of all topics in the range of 1, 5 - 3 pages (a total of 8 topics), which relate to the cultural and social life of the Ruthenian minority, completion of all worksheets (or dictations and work assignments). To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 92%, to obtain an B rating 84%, to obtain a C rating at least 76%, to obtain a D rating 65%, to obtain an E rating at least 51%. A student who obtains less than 51% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of individual evaluations of worksheets and evaluations of the developed topics, and the activity at seminars is also taken into account.

Learning outcomes:

The graduate of the course is able to present:

Knowledge:

- define the graphic system of the Ruthenian language, recognize all graphemes, all phonemes and their correct pronunciation,
- distinguish the graphic system of the Ruthenian normative language and the graphic systems of the neighboring Slavic languages (especially Ukrainian and Slovak), show on the basis of comparison and also the contrast to the differences in the graphic system (vocal and consonant) in these languages.

Skills:

- read texts in Ruthenian normative language fluently and with understanding,
- to write in Cyrillic short stylistic units.

Competences:

- plan their own training in professional life.

1. Practical orthography based on examples of Ruthenian fiction, journalism and professional texts in the field of linguistics. 2. The relationship between the sound and graphic form of standard Ruthenian. 3. Some rules of Ruthenian spelling (full-meaning and non-full-meaning verbs in the context of changes in spelling rules). 4. History of Ruthenians in socio-political contexts. 5. Ruthenians abroad. 6. Shepherd's customs at the Ruthenians. 7. Funeral customs at Ruthenians and Christmas traditions (Kračun).
