Conditions for passing the course: Continuous assessment

The course is completed by continuous assessment. During the semester, the student works on seminars and exercises in the form of practical exercises to acquire the skills of practical communication in the Rusyn normative language. The student prepares a presentation on a preselected professional topic. He will process it in the form of a seminar paper (in the range of 3-4 standard pages) and also in a PP-presentation. Topics are presented to students at the beginning of the semester. Based on grammatical errors in students' works, the lecturer gradually explains the individual orthographic rules with emphasis on the syntax of the Rusyn normative language. The condition for granting credits is active participation in seminars (10%) with a tolerance of 3 justified absences replaced by consultations, submission of a seminar paper (30%) and its PP-presentation to colleagues (30%), completion of worksheets (resp. Dictations and job assignments).) by 5 points each (30%). To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the seminar work, PP-presentation, evaluation of worksheets and seminar activities.

The student prepares a presentation on a preselected professional topic. He will process it in the form of a seminar paper (in the range of 3-4 standard pages) and also in a PP-presentation. Topics are presented to students at the beginning of the semester. Based on grammatical errors in students' works, the lecturer gradually explains the individual orthographic rules with emphasis on the syntax of the Rusyn normative language. The condition for granting credits is active participation in seminars (10%) with a tolerance of 3 justified absences replaced by consultations, submission of a seminar paper (30%) and its PP-presentation to colleagues (30%), completion of worksheets (resp. Dictations and job assignments).) by 5 points each (30%). To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the seminar work, PP-presentation, evaluation of worksheets and seminar activities.

- When preparing the diploma thesis, the student follows the instructions of his / her supervisor and the Directive on the requisites of final theses, their bibliographic registration, control of originality, storage and access issued by the University of Prešov in Prešov. The scope of work can be determined by the training workplace, while the recommended scope (from introduction to conclusion, inclusive) is 50 to 70 standard pages (90,000 to 126,000 characters). The structure of the work and the formal arrangement of the work are determined in agreement with the trainer. 6.
- The final variant of the diploma thesis bound in hardcover will be handed over by the graduate at the department that announced the topic of the thesis. The deadline for submission of diploma theses is set in the schedule of the relevant academic year.
- The diploma thesis is submitted in two printed copies, its electronic version, which must be identical to the printed version, is entered by the student into the system of registration of final theses in PDF format, no later than seven days after submission of the printed version. The originality of the work is assessed in the central register of final theses. A report on the originality of the final thesis is prepared on the result of the originality check. Control of originality is a necessary condition of defense. Based on the result of the overlap of work with other works, the trainer decides whether the work can be the subject of a defense.
- Part of the submission of the work is the conclusion of a license agreement on the use of a digital copy of the work between the author and the Slovak Republic on behalf of the university. After inserting the work into the EZP PU, the author immediately submits

- a draft license agreement signed by him to the training workplace, which must be signed by an authorized representative of the university (the head of the training workplace) within 30 days of sending the work to the CRZP.
- The diploma thesis is assessed by the thesis supervisor and the opponent, who prepares the assessments according to the set criteria.

Conditions for passing the course: Continuous assessment

- Attendance at seminars is mandatory.
- Students will write a seminar paper on a given topic.
- Students submit the seminar paper to the teacher in printed form within the set deadline.
- Two weeks before the end of the semester, students take a written test.
- Percentage of individual tasks in the overall evaluation of students:
- (1) active seminar work: 30%, (2) seminar work: 30%, (3) written test 40%.
- To obtain an A rating (excellent) must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX.
- The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of active participation in seminars, seminar work and written test.

After completing the course the student will get:

Skills:

- Read, pronounce and write Polish text correctly.
- Translate text from ordinary communication using a dictionary from Polish into Slovak (Rusyn).
- Define the basic features of the vocal and consonantal system of the Polish language in comparison with standard Rusyn and Slovak.

Knowledge:

- To characterize related phenomena in the Lemko dialects in Poland and the Rusyn dialects in Slovakia in terms of Polish-Rusyn language contacts.
- Explain the essence of the relationship between standard Polish, Rusyn and Lemko language.
- Characterize the basic features of the morphological system of standard Polish (system of declension of nouns and timing of verbs).

Competences:

- Identify similarities and differences between standard Polish and Rusyn.
- Demonstrates the ability to interpret a Polish text with the definition of basic grammatical features of Polish.

• On the basis of the acquired knowledge to be able to work with Polish professional literature in information book databases.

Course content:

Principles of pronunciation of the Polish language.

- Principles of Polish spelling (Polish alphabet).
- Basics of phonetic and phonological system: system of vowels and consonants, accent, alternations, the latest results of sound level research in Polish linguistics.
- Basics of the morphological system: declension system of nouns, grammatical categories, verb tenses, the latest research results on the morphological level of Polish.
- Similarities and differences in the vocabulary of the Polish language in comparison with standard Slovak and Rusyn.

Voluntary course, 26 lectures / 26 seminars (per semester), combined method

Conditions for passing the course: Continuous assessment

As students who do not study Rusyn language and literature as well as students from abroad are also participants of the Summer School, during the seminars they will receive basic information from sociolinguistics about Rusyn language development from the earliest times to the codification process (1995) with a focus on the use of normative language in Slovakia at present. The student will prepare a seminar paper on this issue, which he / she will present to his / her colleagues (each student focuses in his / her work on one area of the use of the Rusyn language in Slovakia). He also works in the form of practical exercises to acquire the skills of practical communication in the Rusyn normative language and also in the form of elaboration of short stylistic units on simple topics (concerning the cultural and social life of the Rusyns in Slovakia). Acquires the orthographic norm in the form of dictates and autodictates, while dictations are conceived with emphasis on changes and corrections in the rules of Rusyn orthography (changes implemented after 10 years - in 2005 and after twenty-five years - by issuing spelling rules with orthographic dictionary at the end of 2019). He completes a total of 10 hours in the field of sociolinguistics and Rusyn language. Furthermore, the student gets acquainted with the history of Rusyns from the earliest times (a total of 10 hours), while at each seminar participates in a free discussion on the topic. Seminars in ethnology (6 seminars) provide a space to get acquainted with the traditions of the Rusyns (Shepherd's customs, Shovel / kar and Christmas holidays). The condition for granting credits is active participation in seminars, submission of three topics (in the range of 4 - 4.5 pages of text - in the field of language, history and ethnography), and presentation to colleagues in the power point program, where the student can communicate freely on each topic), passing the final test in language, history and ethnography. To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 92%, to obtain an B rating 84%, to obtain a C rating at least 76%, to obtain a D rating 65%, to obtain an E rating at least 51%. A student who obtains less than 51% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of individual evaluations of worksheets and evaluations of the developed topics, and the activity at seminars is also taken into account.

Learning outcomes:

The graduate of the course can:

Knowledge:

- to define the graphic system of the Rusyn normative language and the graphic systems of the neighboring Slavic languages (especially Ukrainian and Slovak), to show, on the basis of comparison and also the contrast, the differences in the graphic system (vocal and consonantal) in these languages,
- define changes in spelling rules in the context of changes after twenty years,
- to define the basic milestones of the historical development of the Rusyns from the earliest times:

Skills:

- read texts in Rusyn normative language fluently and with understanding,
- write different stylistic units in Cyrillic (artistic style, journalistic style, professional style),
- communicate freely in Rusyn normative language,
- prepare a short presentation of Christmas customs at the Rusyns and use it in dramatization in the school environment

Competences:

- plan their own training in professional life.

Course content:

1. Practical orthography based on examples of Rusyn fiction, journalism and professional texts in the field of linguistics. 2. The relationship between the sound and graphic form of standard Rusyn. 3. Some rules of Rusyn spelling (full-meaning and non-full-meaning verbs in the context of changes in spelling rules). 4. History of Rusyns in socio-political contexts. 5. Rusyns abroad. 6. Shepherd's customs at the Rusyns. 7. Funeral customs at Rusyns and Christmas traditions (Kračun).
