Based on the result of the overlap of work with other works, the trainer decides whether the work can be the subject of a defense.</i> <i>Part of the transfer of work is the conclusion of a license agreement on the use of a digital copy of the work between the author and the Slovak Republic on behalf of the university. After inserting the work into the EZP PU, the author immediately submits a draft license agreement signed by him to the training workplace, which must be signed by an authorized representative of the university (the head of the training workplace) within 30 days of sending the work to the CRZP.</i> <i>The bachelor's thesis is assessed by the supervisor and the opponent, who prepares the assessments according to the set criteria.</i> <i>The commission for the final state examinations in a closed session will evaluate the course of the defense and decide on the classification. During the classification, it comprehensively assesses the quality of the work and its defense, taking into account</i> 	

the opinions and the course of the defense, and evaluates with one common mark. The final evaluation can be the same as in the testimonials, but it can also be better, resp. worse, depending on the course of the defense.
