Name of the field of habilitation and inauguration proceeding: Slovak Language and Literature

The field of habilitation and inauguration proceedings of the Slovak Language and Literature field within the broader philological context includes:

- a) knowledge of the functioning of the Slovak language in relevant linguistic-systemic and communication-pragmatic contexts with regard to the structure, development and function of the Slovak language as a national language (in all varietes and communication registers) in intralinguistic, interlinguistic, extralinguistic and all other relevant contexts, both in diachronic and synchronic projection;
- b) knowledge of literary-historical, literary-theoretical and literary-critical aspects of Slovak literature with regard to its development, functioning and links with other literatures.

## Definition of the field of the habilitation and inauguration procedure

The field of Slovak Language and Literature HIP is closely related to the main topics of the core knowledge of philology, mainly through the areas related to:

- a) structure, historical development, social position of the Slovak language in a broader, social, cultural and pragmatic contexts, on the Slovak language in linguistic and communication interaction with other languages in diachronic and synchronic contexts, as well as in connection with language education and development of communication and pragmatic competences and skills with regard to production (speaking, writing), as well as reception (listening and reading comprehension);
- b) acquiring knowledge of the theory of literature, literary science methodology and history, cultivating interpretive skills when working with literary texts and written records from various communication spheres; analysis, interpretation and editing of texts of literary and cultural-historical works and sources.
