Name of the field of habilitation and inauguration proceeding: Literary Theory and History of Specific National Literatures

In addition to general, in-depth knowledge of literary theory and specific national literatures (Slovak, German, Russian, etc. literary history), the field of study also includes the latest, specific knowledge of the individual components of literary theory (versology, genology, thematology, narratology, imagology, etc.), as well as research into unexplored areas of literary history, authors, and their works. Interdisciplinary contexts or knowledge concernig a particular cultural area, the methodology of literary studies, and developmental tendencies in literary-critical thought are also explored.

On the basis of the core topics of the study field of philology, within the literary theory and history of specific national literatures HIP are achieved knowledge, skills and competences related to:

- 1. in-depth acquisition of the history of specific national literatures (also in an international context and with interdisciplinary overlap) and knowledge of literary theory and literary methodology, in its synchrony and diachrony, with the application of critical, independent thinking and own conclusions;
- 2. cultivating interpretive skills when working with literary texts and written records from diverse communication spheres;
- 3. literary-critical, axiological interpretation of the latest Slovak literature with awareness of the social and ethno-cultural complex.
