Editorial

Dear readers.

In the 22nd issue of *Studia Philosophica Kantiana*, issued at the end of 2022, two articles by Slovak professors of philosophy are published. The first article, *Kant and the Issue of Extraterrestrial Intelligence* by Eugen Andreánský, brings up an interesting topic, which is extraterrestrial beings and extraterrestrial intelligence in Kant's work. The article *Reflections on Kant's philosophy in Slovakia in the 18th and 19th centuries* by Rudolf Dupkala, a specialist in the history of Slovak philosophy, focuses on how Kant was interpreted by József Rozgonyi, Štefan Tichý, Ján Babtista Horvát, Žigmund Karlovský, Michal Greguš, Andrej Vandrák, and Matej Szlávik.

Two reviews are published in the journal, the first one is devoted to the collection on Kant and the possibility of progress, the other one is a review of a monograph by the Slovak author Peter Kyslan, whose book comparing the phenomenon of culture in Kant and Herder was published this year.

It is good news that Kantian research at the University of Prešov is not stagnating, the authors regularly publish scientific papers and monographs on Kant's philosophical legacy, deal with scientific research tasks from research projects, and participate in international scientific conferences. Recently, a PhD student at the Institute of Philosophy of the Faculty of Arts participated in an international doctoral event on Kant's philosophy at the University of Vechta, and she has prepared a report on it for this issue.

The issue concludes with Zlatica Plašienková's remembrance of the eminent Slovak philosopher Teodor Münz, who died on 14 July 2022. Teodor Münz was an outstanding expert on Kant's philosophy and the main translator of his writings into Slovak. He and the founder of Studia Philosophica Kantiana, Lubomír Belás, who also passed away this year, shared not only a common interest in the philosophy of the European Enlightenment, German classical philosophy, and especially Immanuel Kant, but also modesty, diligence, and a great respect for each other. Let us hope that, in addition to their philosophical legacy, these qualities of theirs will also inspire us. We are publishing this obituary of Teodor Münz in both Slovak and German.
