


INTRODUCTION

- County: Kerry
- First and the oldest national park in Ireland 1932
- 103 km2
- includes: Lakes of Killarney, Mangerton Mountain, Torc Mountain, Shehy Mountain, Purple Mountain

RHODODENDRON PONTICUM in KNP

- There are over 900 species of rhododendron but Rhododendron ponticum is the only invasive one
- was introduced to Killarney in the 19th century and began to spread quite quickly
- creates dense thickets, blocking light and preventing the regeneration of native oak forest plants. It is a classic example of what ecologists call "invasive alien species".
- Growth is slow in the first 4 years and after 10 years the plant can start to become
 multi-stemmed and even earlier if the shoot is damaged. Within 25-30 years mature
 plants may start to extend latterly connecting with other plants.
- Flowering is usually concentrated in a two week period between May and June
- Rhododendron is best suited to acidic soils however it has been naturalized on soils with a pH range from







MY WORK - main job

CONTROLLING/TREATING THE RHODODENDRON PONTICUM IN NATIVE PRIORITY WOODLANND AND BOGLAND HABITATS BY USING STEM TREATMENT

- This method is carried out by making cuts with hatchet into the plants stem in the bottom of the stem and filling the cuts with a 14% solution of glyphospate immediately after cuts are made.
- A nontoxic food colorant dye is also added to the solution to indicate treated plants

1. Cut into the stem



2. Application of herbicide



3. Breaking top of the plant (for identification the plant was treated)

There is also trail for visually impaired which has to be maintained








BIRD SURVEY

LOOKING FOR MARSH FRITILLARY (EUPHYDRYAS AURINIA) LARVAL WEBS ON BERE ISLAND

- The Marsh Fritillary Butterfly is one of Ireland's few legally protected Butterflies. It is protected under Annex II of the European Union Habitats and Species Directive.
- In collaboration with the <u>National Parks and Wildlife Service</u>, the <u>Northern Ireland Environment Agency</u> and <u>Butterfly Conservation Northern Ireland</u>, since 2015 the Data Centre trialled and established an All-island Marsh Fritillary Monitoring Scheme across 49 core sites for this species.
- these webs only occur in late August and September on the specific foodplant of the caterpillar Devil's-bit Scabious (*Succisa pratensis*).
