The condition for passing the continuous assessment is to obtain the final sum of points from the partial evaluation during semester and the written test for at least 50 %. The final assessment will be composed of the partial evaluation activities, such as semester work, assignment, project, test (makes up 40 % of the total evaluation), where the selection of individual evaluated activities will be in the competence of the lecturer and the written test (makes up 60 % of the total evaluation) according to the pre-announced key by the lecturer.</i>  <i>Final assessment:</i> <i>A 100,00 - 90,00 %; B 89,99 – 80,00 %; C 79,9 – 70,00 %; D 69,99 - 60,00 %; E 59,99 - 50,00 %; FX 49,99 and less %.
