Form of assessment: <i>The course ends with an exam. During the semester, the student actively participates in lectures and seminars, with a tolerance of 3 justified absences, which will be replaced by additional work. During the semester, the student processes, presents at the seminar and submits a seminar paper. During the exam period, he performs an oral exam or test. To obtain an A rating (excellent) he must obtain at least 90%, to obtain a B rating 80%, to obtain a C rating at least 70%, to obtain a D rating 60%, to obtain an E rating at least 50%. A student who obtains less than 50% will be graded FX. The final evaluation is calculated as the average of the evaluation of the seminar work and its PP-presentation (40%), seminar activities (10%) and final test (50%).</i>

Can name the priorities of Ruthenians in the field of language, culture and national life development after 1989. Can define the results achieved in the field of language, culture and national identity development of Ruthenians after 1989.</i>	
<i>Competences</i> <i>He can distinguish, based on available sources, phonological, morphological, lexical, syntactic and word-formation peculiarities of the Ruthenian standard in Slovakia in comparison with the literary norms in Poland, Hungary, Ukraine and Serbia. Can demonstrate a good orientation in the review of literature devoted to this issue. Can search, process and analyze information from a variety of information sources and interpret and publicly present this knowledge using appropriate terminology.</i>
