Our doctoral program in Anthropology offers a dynamic, interdisciplinary education that prepares students for cutting-edge research and global academic engagement. Combining biological and sociocultural anthropology, the curriculum explores human genetics, ecology, ethology, and cultural diversity. Students gain hands-on experience with advanced methods including somatometry, osteometry, dermatoglyphics, 3D imaging, PCR, and DNA sequencing. Specialized training covers forensic anthropology, paleopathology, and molecular genetics, with a focus on gene polymorphisms and musculoskeletal disorders. Research spans child development, nutrition, population variability, and behavioural analysis, with strong ties to paediatrics, epidemiology, endocrinology, and cardiology. Beyond science, the program fosters societal impact—promoting cultural understanding, social cohesion, and solutions to global challenges. Graduates emerge as skilled researchers and thought leaders in both academic and applied contexts.
